The Right To Play Foundation is Going Ahead With Its Project

The people of Piedecuesta of all ages will now be able to play golf The golf facility will be located in Barroblanco in the west of the city

The Right To Play Foundation is a non-profit organization whose goal is to allow the public, especially the poorer families and children, to learn and play golf.

To convert this objective into a reality, the owners have bought a piece of land in the Barroblanco neighborhood of Piedecuesta.

Here, they have already started working on the course, but are still raising funds to complete the project and currently have

secured 30% of the finances needed

“The golf course design is ready, part of the grass has already been seeded, now we are hoping that we can get cooperation from the local government and local companies that might be interested in investing in the project”, said Sandra Gonzalez, vice president of the Foundation.

A complete facility

The facility will be comprised of a course for adults that will include 6 par 3 holes. There will

be a small course for children consisting of 4 par 3 holes that will be free for kids between the ages of 6 and 15.

In addition, there will be a covered Miniature Golf course, a practice facility and a club house.

For now, Anthony Ciabattini, president of the foundation hopes that the licenses to build and work will be quickly approved and also that the access road to the course will be paved.
